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Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA) 2025

The Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA) is a comprehensive nationwide agricultural campaign launched by the Government of India in 2025 with the objective of modernizing farming practices and empowering farmers through the effective transfer of scientific knowledge. Officially launched on May 29, 2025, from Puri, Odisha, the campaign was initiated under the leadership of Union Agriculture Minister Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressing the nation virtually during the inauguration. In his address, the Prime Minister highlighted the importance of this initiative in driving agricultural transformation and strengthening India's commitment to becoming a global agricultural leader.

Running for 15 days from May 29 to June 12, 2025, VKSA is remarkable in its scale and coordination. It aims to reach approximately 1.5 crore farmers across over 700 districts and 65,000 villages spanning nearly 20 states. The campaign involves 2,170 scientific teams working in synergy with 731 Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs), 113 ICAR institutes, and officials from state departments of agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, and fisheries. VKSA is conducted twice a year, ahead of both the Kharif and Rabi sowing seasons, to ensure that farmers receive timely, location-specific, and crop-relevant scientific guidance.

The core focus areas of VKSA include the adoption of improved crop production techniques, enhancement of soil health management, and optimization of input use for greater efficiency and sustainability. The campaign places special emphasis on the dissemination of climate-resilient crop varieties, water conservation technologies, integrated pest management, and post-harvest solutions. One of its significant components is guiding farmers in the effective use of Soil Health Cards for selecting suitable crops and applying balanced fertilizers. VKSA also promotes the concept of nutrition gardens to enhance household food and nutrition security and provides actionable strategies to help farmers cope with the impacts of climate change on agriculture and aquaculture.

This ambitious campaign embodies Prime Minister Modi's "Lab to Land" vision, which seeks to bridge the critical knowledge gap between scientific research conducted in laboratories and its practical application on farms. It reinforces the government's focus on science-driven, climate-resilient, and farmer-centric agricultural development, aligning with India's broader goal of becoming the "Food Basket of the World." By empowering rural communities with cutting-edge knowledge and tools, VKSA is building a resilient agricultural ecosystem that fosters self-reliance, sustainability, and inclusive growth.

VKSA is also a vital pillar of the Viksit Bharat vision for 2047, acknowledging that the transformation of agriculture is key to overall national progress. The campaign exemplifies the government's commitment to reaching every farmer, even in the most remote and challenging terrains. This is evidenced by its implementation in Komic, the world's highest motorable village situated at 4,587 meters above sea level. Through its wide reach and grassroots engagement, VKSA stands as a transformative force in Indian agriculture, blending scientific innovation with on-the-ground implementation to achieve sustainable growth and long-term empowerment of India's farming community.

The Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA), launched on May 29, 2025, is a nationwide initiative aimed at modernizing agriculture and empowering farmers through scientific knowledge transfer. As part of this 15-day campaign running until June 12, 2025, KVK Rourkela is actively participating by reaching out to farmers across Sundargarh district with field-level demonstrations, awareness programs, and technical guidance. In coordination with ICAR institutes and local agriculture departments, KVK Rourkela is focusing on promoting climate-resilient crop varieties, soil health management through Soil Health Cards, integrated pest management, and the adoption of water-saving technologies.

By conducting village-level interactions and showcasing improved agricultural and allied sector practices, KVK Rourkela is helping bridge the gap between scientific research and farmers' fields, aligning with Prime Minister Modi's "Lab to Land" vision. The campaign also highlights nutrition garden models, balanced fertilizer application, and post-harvest management strategies to ensure food security, sustainability, and income enhancement for local farming communities. Through VKSA, KVK Rourkela reaffirms its commitment to inclusive and resilient agricultural development, contributing to the national goal of transforming India into the "Food Basket of the World."

Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA) Implementation by KVK Rourkela with collaboration with ICAR-CRRI, Cuttack

The Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA), launched on May 29, 2025, is a visionary initiative spearheaded by the Government of India to revolutionize Indian agriculture through widespread dissemination of scientific knowledge, cutting-edge technologies, and sustainable farming practices. This campaign is aligned with the broader national vision of “Viksit Bharat @2047”, with agriculture serving as a key pillar for self-reliance, food security, and rural development. As part of this ambitious nationwide campaign, KVK Rourkela, under the administrative control of ICAR and OUAT, has undertaken extensive grassroots-level implementation in collaboration with ICAR-Central Rice Research Institute (CRRI), Cuttack, across eight strategically important blocks of Sundargarh district, namely **Bisra, Bonai, Lathikata, Koida, Lahunipara, Kuarmunda, Gurundia, and Nuagaon.**

The objective of VKSA in Sundargarh is to bridge the critical gap between scientific research and farm-level practices, particularly among tribal and marginalized communities residing in remote and challenging agro-ecological zones. The campaign was launched as a 15-day pre-Kharif season initiative, with a focus on capacity building, field demonstrations, awareness generation, and technology transfer. Farmers across the eight blocks were sensitized to the latest developments in rice production technology, climate-resilient agriculture, resource-use efficiency, integrated farming systems, and improved soil and water management practices.

To ensure effective implementation, KVK Rourkela and ICAR-CRRI jointly deployed expert teams comprising agricultural scientists, field coordinators, and extension professionals who engaged with local farming communities through scientist-farmer interactions, field visits, input demonstrations, and training sessions. Dr Jayanta Pati, Sanjay Kumar Pradhan, Samarendra Baral, Anubha B Kujur from KVK Rourkela and Dr Milan Kumar Lal from ICAR-CRRI, Cuttack. Particular emphasis was placed on promoting the use of climate-resilient rice varieties developed by ICAR-CRRI, which are suitable for rainfed, drought-prone, and flood-prone areas—agro-climatic conditions commonly found in Sundargarh district. Farmers were trained on the adoption of short-duration and stress-tolerant paddy varieties, which can improve productivity and reduce vulnerability to weather fluctuations. A key highlight of the campaign was the effective demonstration and utilization of Soil Health Cards (SHC). Many farmers in these blocks had received SHCs in previous years but were unaware of how to interpret the data and translate it into agronomic decisions. KVK Rourkela conducted intensive SHC

awareness sessions, helping farmers understand their soil nutrient status, choose appropriate crops, and apply balanced fertilizers. This not only enhances crop yield but also supports long-term soil fertility and environmental sustainability.

Another major component of the VKSA implementation was Integrated Nutrient Management (INM) and Integrated Pest Management (IPM). Through live demonstrations in farmers' fields, the teams showcased how to reduce dependency on chemical inputs by integrating organic amendments, biofertilizers, biopesticides, and locally available resources. Farmers were introduced to *Trichoderma*, *Azospirillum*, and *Rhizobium* cultures, as well as to natural pest repellents and eco-friendly crop protection strategies. This helped promote low-input, high-efficiency farming systems that are economically viable and ecologically sustainable. Water-use efficiency was another central theme of the campaign. Given the variable rainfall pattern and depleting groundwater levels in some pockets of Sundargarh, farmers were encouraged to adopt Alternate Wetting and Drying (AWD) method in rice cultivation, alongside ridge-furrow planting, mulching, and rainwater harvesting techniques. Micro-irrigation models and community-level water conservation approaches were also discussed during farmer field schools organized in various villages.

Nutrition-sensitive agriculture was promoted through the establishment of nutrition gardens (poshan bagicha) in rural households. These gardens are designed to ensure year-round availability of diverse and nutrient-rich food crops, especially leafy greens, tubers, legumes, and fruits. Special training was provided to women farmers and members of Self Help Groups (SHGs), focusing on household food security, dietary diversity, and child nutrition. The initiative received strong community interest and participation, especially in Gurundia and Koida blocks. Post-harvest management and value addition practices were also demonstrated during VKSA activities. Farmers were trained on techniques to reduce post-harvest losses, proper drying and storage of grains, use of low-cost threshers, and packaging of farm produce for better market realization. These sessions were particularly beneficial for tribal farmers who often face infrastructure and logistics constraints in accessing formal markets.

A unique feature of the campaign in Sundargarh was the involvement of youth and schoolchildren in agricultural awareness rallies and quiz competitions. These outreach efforts aimed to instill interest in agriculture among the younger generation while reinforcing the importance of food security, environmental conservation, and climate-resilient farming.

The campaign saw enthusiastic participation from more than 20,000 farmers, including over 12,000 women, across all eight blocks. The events were coordinated with the support of block-level agriculture officers, panchayat members, SHGs, FPOs (Farmer Producer Organizations), and local NGOs. Farmers were provided with information leaflets, seed kits, soil test reports, and on-spot advisory services. Feedback from participants indicated a high level of satisfaction and eagerness to adopt many of the recommended practices. The collaborative approach between KVK Rourkela and ICAR-CRRI, Cuttack, ensured the scientific integrity and contextual relevance of the technologies being transferred. CRRI scientists provided detailed technical insights into varietal selection, stress physiology, and cultivation methods, while KVK Rourkela's extension staff ensured local translation, logistics, and community engagement. This synergy between research and extension institutions was crucial in driving home the core philosophy of "Lab to Land", as envisioned by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

VKSA-2025 campaign in Sundargarh not only improved farmers' technical knowledge but also strengthened the institutional linkages between farmers, researchers, and development agencies. It has laid a strong foundation for future collaborations and long-term capacity building in the region. The campaign successfully brought the national mission of "Viksit Bharat" to the doorsteps of remote and tribal farming communities, underscoring the power of inclusive, science-driven agricultural transform.

Block wise Activity Summary

Block Bisra

Bisra, Sundargarh, Odisha

Under the nationwide initiative of “Viksit Bharat 2047”, the “Viksit Krishi” programme was successfully organized in Bisra Gram Panchayat, covering the villages of Bisra, Budeljore, Puruna Bisra, and San-Pokhar. The programme aimed to empower farmers with advanced agricultural knowledge, improve awareness of government schemes, and promote sustainable farming practices suitable for the upcoming Kharif season. The event began with a brief inaugural session, followed by technical sessions led by scientists, Sarpanch, Samiti member, BAO Bisra, AAO Panposh, VAS, AFO, ADH, and other agriculture extension experts. Farmers were sensitized to various aspects of improved crop production practices, particularly for rice and pulses. Emphasis was laid on the use of climate-resilient and high-yielding varieties, seed treatment, integrated nutrient and pest management, and water-saving agronomic practices like the DSR techniques. A key highlight of the programme was the demonstration of soil health-based fertilizer recommendations. Farmers were guided on interpreting Soil Health Cards and selecting the right fertilizer dose based on their field’s nutrient status. Awareness was also created about the long-term benefits of organic amendments and use of biofertilizers. Special focus was given to women farmers and youth through separate group interactions promoting nutrition gardens, mushroom cultivation, and agro-processing as livelihood options. Various central schemes such as PM-KISAN, PMFBY, KCC, and e-NAM were explained in simple language, and the process for enrollment and benefits was shared. Promotion of modern farming techniques included discussions on natural farming to sustain soil health and reduce chemical hazards, mechanisation, the adoption of drudgery-reducing farm implements, and the use of modern fertilizers like nano Urea and DAP, including their application via drones. The interface featured a robust interaction phase where farmers raised practical queries concerning issues such as pest control, water management, soil health, marketing, and credit facilities, as well as various doubts about the discussed schemes and new initiatives. The scientists provided affordable and scientific solutions in response, offering information on proper centres to approach for financial benefits and discussing the use of soil health cards and Kisan Credit Cards. Other issues raised by farmers were recorded for necessary follow-up action. Supplementary activities involved the distribution of pamphlets and leaflets containing scientific practices. In addition, improved seeds and technical leaflets in Odia were distributed

to the participants. Farmers enthusiastically took part in the interactive “Farmer-Scientist” discussion, voicing their challenges and suggesting area-specific innovations. Feedback was documented for further action and policy recommendations. The event witnessed active participation from 250 farmers (107 male and 143 female), indicating a high level of community engagement and interest. The programme concluded with a vote of thanks and a collective resolution to adopt improved, climate-smart, and sustainable agricultural practices for a prosperous rural future.





Jaraikela, Bisra, Sundargarh, Odisha

The Farmer-Scientist Interface Meeting under the Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan was successfully organized in Jariekela GP of Bisra Block, Villages covered.- Jareikela, Kopsingha, Mahiberna, Budhikani, Bhurtabahal Sundargarh district. The event served as a vibrant platform to connect researchers, extension personnel, and the local farming community with the goal of promoting scientific, sustainable, and inclusive agricultural development. The program began with the inauguration of the Krishi Rath (Agri-chariot), which traveled through the five villages to create awareness and mobilize participation among farmers. The Rath served as an effective medium to deliver audio-visual messages and distribute informative materials on modern farming techniques. Following the inauguration, technical sessions were held addressing the agricultural scenario of the region, including prevailing climatic conditions, land use patterns, and major cropping systems. Experts from various disciplines engaged the farmers in interactive sessions on integrated pest and disease management, animal husbandry, and fishery-based livelihood opportunities relevant to the local context. Key challenges such as soil degradation, climate variability, and limited access to quality inputs were discussed in depth. Farmers were educated on the importance of quality seed use, including certified and farm-saved seeds, and encouraged to undertake community-level seed production of open-pollinated varieties to ensure local self-reliance and timely availability. Special attention was given to women farmers, focusing on barriers limiting their participation and empowering them through nutrition-sensitive agriculture, backyard poultry, and post-harvest management training suggestions. The use of natural farming techniques to restore soil health and reduce chemical usage was also promoted alongside demonstrations on mechanization and drudgery-reducing tools. The application of nano-fertilizers like nano Urea and DAP using drones was introduced as a cost-effective and eco-friendly innovation. The interface allowed farmers to directly voice their concerns about input supply, pest control, water management, marketing infrastructure, and access to credit. Scientists responded with practical, scientific, and affordable solutions, directing them to appropriate government departments and services. Emphasis was laid on using Soil Health Cards, availing Kisan Credit Cards (KCC), and benefiting from the 15 flagship schemes and 6 new initiatives under Budget 2025–2026. Information leaflets in Odia on farming best practices were distributed, and local indigenous knowledge and innovations were documented for further study and validation. Farmers provided positive feedback and highlighted the need for focused training on protected cultivation and storage practices. The programme witnessed active participation from 250 farmers (192 male and 58 female), and successfully bridged the gap between field-level challenges and research-based solutions, paving the way for a more resilient and knowledge-driven agricultural future in the region.





Block Banei

Jakeikela, Banei, Sundargarh, Odisha

Venue: Jakeikela Block: Bonai, District: Sundargarh Villages Covered: Jakeikela, Talita, Badgugua, Jamkei, Kelo Date: 30-05-2025 Participants: Total – 250 (Male – 97, Female – 153) As part of the ongoing Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan, a Farmer-Scientist Interface and awareness programme was organized at Jakeikela village, covering five surrounding villages under Bonai Block, Sundargarh. The event aimed to create awareness among farmers on scientific agricultural practices, government schemes, and local challenges. The programme began with the Krishi Rath inauguration, drawing attention of the rural farming community with audio-visual displays on modern farming. Technical sessions followed, where experts provided insights into climate-resilient farming, integrated pest and nutrient management, and the promotion of natural and organic farming techniques. Farmers were guided on the importance of certified seeds, soil health-based fertilizer application, and the use of modern tools including nano urea and drone spraying techniques. Gender-specific issues were

addressed through interactive sessions with women farmers, focusing on nutrition gardening, income diversification, and drudgery reduction. Awareness was also raised on 15 key government schemes including PM-KISAN, PMFBY, KCC, and 6 new initiatives from Union Budget 2025–26. Farmers participated actively in the open discussion, raising queries related to marketing, pest issues, irrigation, and input access. Scientists provided site-specific, low-cost, scientific solutions. The event concluded with the distribution of technical pamphlets and collection of farmers' feedback and Indigenous Technological Knowledge (ITK) for future refinement of strategies.





Gilly, Banei, Sundargarh, Odisha

The Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan outreach programme was conducted at Gilli village under Bonai Block, Sundargarh, covering four villages viz., Gilli, Boneikela, Deoposh, Badgaon. The event served as a vital interface between scientists, extension workers, and the farming community, aiming to spread awareness on advanced farming techniques, resource sustainability, and government schemes. The programme commenced with the Krishi Rath inauguration, which visited the participating villages to disseminate key messages related to modern agriculture, input use efficiency, and farm mechanization. The Rath attracted large farmer participation and set the tone for the day's technical sessions. The technical discussions covered a wide array of topics, including climate-smart agriculture, soil health management, seed quality, and cropping system optimization under changing climate conditions. Emphasis was given on the use of natural farming techniques, drone-based input application, and mechanisation for cost and labour efficiency. Farmers were sensitized to the benefits of nano fertilizers such as nano urea and DAP, along with correct dosage and timing of application. Experts highlighted 15 central government schemes like PMFBY, PM-KISAN, e-NAM, and KCC, as well as six new schemes introduced in Budget 2025–26. Women's participation was significant, and dedicated sessions addressed their needs in nutrition-sensitive farming, value addition, and low-cost income-generating practices. Farmers raised queries on pest outbreaks, input availability, irrigation methods, and subsidy access, which were answered by the scientists with localized, scientific solutions. Pamphlets in local language were distributed, and

Indigenous Technical Knowledge (ITK) and field-specific feedback were collected for further evaluation and support.



Block Lathikata

Ranto, Lathikata, Sundargarh, Odisha

Total participants 250 Male 115 Female 135 Date: 31st May 2025 Venue: Village – Ranto, Gram Panchayat – Birkera, Block – Lathikata, District – Sundargarh, Odisha Total Participants: 250 (Male: 115, Female: 135) A field visit-cum-awareness programme was organized at Village Ranto, under Birkera Gram Panchayat of Lathikata Block, Sundargarh district, Odisha on 31st May 2025. The program was graced by S.J. Jual Oram, Hon'ble Minister of Tribal Affairs, Government of India, as the Chief Guest. The objective of the visit was to disseminate information and generate awareness among tribal communities about the various welfare and development schemes of the Central and State Governments, with a focus on agriculture, tribal upliftment, and rural development. The program witnessed enthusiastic participation from local farmers, women self-help groups, panchayat representatives, and officials from agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, soil conservation, and other line departments. A total of 250 participants, including 115 men and 135 women, attended the event, reflecting a strong community interest in development initiatives. In his address, S.J. Jual Oram highlighted the ongoing efforts of the Government of India to empower tribal populations through schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Vikas Mission, Van Dhan Vikas Kendra, Eklavya Model Residential Schools, and PM Awas Yojana (Gramin). He emphasized the importance of convergence among Central and State schemes to maximize benefits for rural communities and improve their livelihoods. He also encouraged tribal youth to engage with skilling and entrepreneurship initiatives promoted under various tribal welfare programs. The event featured participation from key administrative and technical officials including Bijaya Kumar Nayak (Sub-Collector, Panposh), Dr. Prasanna Ku. Maharana (SDVO), Lalbhuni Mallaik (CDAO, Sundargarh), and scientists from KVK Sundargarh-I & II who shared insights on climate-resilient agriculture, soil health management, horticulture diversification, and livestock development. Sessions were also conducted on millet promotion, in line with the International Year of Millets initiative. Field-level officers like AHO, BVO, AAO, and AFO shared information on departmental schemes, subsidies, and farmer advisory services. Progressive farmers and local panchayat representatives including Sarpanchs from nearby villages shared their experiences and highlighted local challenges related to irrigation, market access, and input supply. Special attention was given to women farmers and SHG members, with encouragement to adopt income-generating activities like mushroom cultivation, backyard poultry, and agro-processing. The event concluded with an interactive Q&A session where farmers directly raised their concerns and received responses from experts and government representatives. The visit fostered a spirit of collaboration and

created a platform for integrated planning and implementation of tribal and rural development initiatives.





Lathikata, Sundargarh, Odisha

Venue: Lathikata, Gram Panchayat – Lathikata, Block – Lathikata, District – Sundargarh, Odisha Villages Covered: Lathikata, Jalda, Kansar, Nuagaon Total Participants: 250 (Male: 108, Female: 142) A second awareness-cum-interaction program was successfully conducted at Lathikata village under Lathikata Gram Panchayat of the same block on 31st May 2025. The program aimed to spread awareness among the tribal and rural population regarding

government schemes and to ensure better convergence and implementation at the grassroots level. The session also aimed at strengthening the coordination between community members and various line departments for inclusive rural development. The event drew participation from four major villages—Lathikata, Jalda, Kansar, and Nuagaon—with a total of 250 people attending (108 male and 142 female participants). A significant number of women attendees reflected growing awareness and interest among women in taking part in development activities, entrepreneurship, and community welfare. Sh. Jual Oram, Hon'ble Minister of Tribal Affairs, Government of India, once again addressed the gathering and encouraged the people to take maximum advantage of various Central Government schemes designed for tribal welfare, including the Van Dhan Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana – Gramin, and Eklavya Model Residential Schools. He emphasized the importance of education, health, and sustainable livelihoods, and encouraged local youth to explore skill development programs under PM Kaushal Vikas Yojana. The program was coordinated with active involvement of key district and block-level officials. The officials delivered presentations and briefed the participants on various agricultural and livestock-related schemes, financial support for SHGs, organic farming practices, soil health management, and government support for setting up agro-based enterprises. KVK scientists demonstrated simple and sustainable farming techniques and shared success stories of local farmers who adopted improved practices. Panchayat representatives and progressive farmers shared field-level issues like water scarcity, input delivery, lack of storage infrastructure, and requested support for farm mechanization and irrigation facilities. The interaction helped identify actionable points for follow-up by respective departments. Special focus was given to encouraging women in agri-entrepreneurship, including mushroom cultivation, backyard poultry, vermicomposting, and kitchen gardening. The session concluded with assurances from the officials for continued support and follow-up visits to address village-level issues. The event was well-received and served as an important platform for empowering rural stakeholders through awareness and direct communication with policymakers and technical experts.

Block Koida

Jamudihi, Koida, Sundargarh, Odisha

Venue: Jamudihi, Block – Koida, District – Sundargarh, Odisha Villages Covered: Jamudihi, Chordhara, Kunchpani, Kundunibuni, Motuttanman (Total: 6 villages) Total Participants: 600 (Male: 335, Female: 265) An extensive outreach and awareness programme was held on 2nd June 2025 at Jamudihi, Block Koida, with active participation from six villages. The event was part of a series of visits aimed at disseminating information about Central and State Government schemes for tribal welfare, agriculture, rural development, and livelihood enhancement. The programme was graced by Sj. Laxman Munda, Hon'ble MLA of Bonai Constituency, as the Chief Guest. Also present was Nelson Munda, Sarpanch of the host Gram Panchayat, along with a large gathering of local farmers, SHG members, youth, and village elders. A total of 600 people attended, with strong male participation (335) and significant female representation (265), reflecting keen interest from all sections of the community. In his address, Sj. Laxman Munda spoke about the Government's commitment to the all-round development of tribal-dominated areas through targeted policies and infrastructure development. He highlighted the role of key flagship schemes such as: Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Vikas Mission, Van Dhan Yojana. The local Sarpanch Nelson Munda welcomed the dignitaries and shared the ground-level status of development work in the panchayat, including the need for improvement in irrigation, drinking water facilities, road connectivity, and employment opportunities. The program also saw participation from technical and administrative officials from agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, and rural development departments. Demonstrations were organized by KVK experts and

agriculture officers on sustainable farming practices, pest and disease management, organic inputs, and soil health improvement. Representatives from the Animal Husbandry Department shared details about free vaccination drives, mobile veterinary services, and incentives for goatery, poultry, and dairy units. Youth were encouraged to join skill development programs under DDU-GKY and PM Kaushal Vikas Yojana. Women SHGs from the region participated actively and displayed products like pickles, leaf plates, and minor forest produce (MFP) items. They were motivated to register under the Van Dhan Vikas Kendra scheme for better value addition and marketing. The event also included an interactive Q&A session, where villagers raised concerns regarding land rights, ration distribution, MGNREGA work delays, and PDS coverage. Officials took note of the issues for prompt resolution. Overall, the visit was highly impactful in creating awareness, identifying gaps, and strengthening the bridge between governance and grassroots. The programme concluded with a vote of thanks and assurances of regular follow-up and departmental support.





K Balang, Koida, Sundargarh, Odisha

Venue: K. Balang, Block – Koida, District – Sundargarh, Odisha Villages Covered: 6 (Names not specified) Total Participants: 620 (Male: 376, Female: 244) As part of the continued outreach efforts to tribal and remote rural regions, a large-scale awareness and interaction program was organized at K. Balang, under Koida Block, on 2nd June 2025. The event was aimed at sensitizing villagers about various schemes of the Central and State Governments focused on agriculture, tribal welfare, livestock development, women empowerment, and rural livelihood. The programme witnessed overwhelming participation from six nearby villages, with a total of 620 participants—376 men and 244 women. This strong turnout reflected the growing interest of rural communities in accessing and benefiting from government initiatives. The programme was led by Dr. Lalbihari Mallaik, Chief District Agriculture Officer (CDAO), Sundargarh, who played a pivotal role in coordinating the event and ensuring multi-

departmental participation. In his address, Dr. Mallaik highlighted various agriculture and horticulture schemes implemented in the district and urged farmers to adopt improved technologies and practices to increase productivity and income. The session began with introductory remarks by local PRI members and community leaders, who welcomed the guests and appreciated the government's outreach efforts. They also shared their village-specific concerns, including irrigation scarcity, lack of cold storage, need for animal health services, and inputs for rabi crops. Officials from line departments, including Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Soil Conservation, and Rural Development, provided detailed presentations on key schemes. Technical officers conducted demonstrations on seed treatment, organic composting, kitchen gardening, and low-cost polyhouse structures. The horticulture team encouraged farmers to take up fruit orchards and floriculture with available subsidies. Particular attention was given to livestock health and productivity enhancement. Mobile veterinary services, free vaccination camps, and improved livestock management practices were discussed. The Veterinary Assistant Surgeon addressed queries on goater, poultry, and piggery rearing and invited farmers to upcoming training sessions. Women's Self Help Groups (SHGs) from the region showcased their locally made forest products, leaf plates, and food items. They were briefed about the Mission Shakti program and guided on how to link with Van Dhan Vikas Kendras for income generation through value addition of Minor Forest Produce (MFP). The interactive session at the end provided an open platform for villagers to raise grievances and receive on-the-spot clarification from officials. Several beneficiaries were identified for further departmental follow-up and inclusion under pending schemes. The visit was a major success in fostering government-community collaboration and bringing governance to the doorstep of remote tribal hamlets.



Gopna, Koida, Sundargarh, Odisha

The objective was to create awareness among rural communities about government schemes and development programs related to agriculture, tribal welfare, livestock, women empowerment, and infrastructure development. The event attracted significant participation from seven villages in the surrounding region, with a total of 635 attendees – 382 men and 253 women. The high turnout showcased the enthusiasm

of villagers to engage directly with officials and access developmental opportunities. The program was convened in the presence of local panchayat leadership, with Mrs. Mukta Munda, the Sarpanch of the Gram Panchayat, presiding over the welcome address. In her remarks, Sarpanch Mukta Munda emphasized the need for improved basic amenities such as road connectivity, drinking water supply, irrigation infrastructure, and job opportunities for youth. She appreciated the outreach efforts and called for greater collaboration between villagers and line departments for successful implementation of schemes. The session included participation from district- and block-level officials of Agriculture, Horticulture, Soil Conservation, Animal Husbandry, Rural Development, and Women & Child Development departments. Experts from Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) also contributed through technical demonstrations and advisories. Demonstrations on seed treatment, vermicomposting, organic inputs, and soil health cards were conducted. KVK scientists encouraged farmers to diversify crops, take up intercropping, and adopt climate-resilient farming practices. The Animal Husbandry team briefed villagers on vaccination drives, disease control, fodder development, and incentives for backyard poultry and goat farming. Veterinary doctors also addressed livestock health queries raised by the farmers. Women's Self Help Groups (SHGs) from nearby villages participated actively and were guided on income-generating activities such as mushroom cultivation, value addition of non-timber forest produce (NTFP), and accessing credit and marketing support through Van Dhan Vikas Kendras. The event ended with a robust interactive session, where villagers discussed their concerns about ration card distribution, irrigation challenges, and access to health services. Officials took note of the grievances and promised departmental follow-up and handholding. This visit successfully bridged the gap between rural communities and administrative systems, and reaffirmed the government's commitment to inclusive and participatory rural development.

The primary

objective of the program was to inform and empower rural and tribal communities about various welfare schemes of the Central and State Governments, with a special focus on agriculture, tribal development, health, livelihood generation, and women's empowerment. The programme drew participants from seven villages—Musharpali, Talbahali, Rajamunda, Jumani, Gudhali, Lahunipada, and Lamsi—bringing together a total of 607 villagers (334 male and 273 female participants). The significant representation of women highlighted growing awareness and involvement in developmental initiatives and self-help group activities. The programme was chaired by Mrs. Malati Kisan, Sarpanch of Rajamunda Gram Panchayat, who welcomed all dignitaries and participants. In her address, she expressed gratitude to the district and block officials for bringing such valuable awareness programs to the grassroots. She also highlighted local development needs, especially in road infrastructure, piped drinking water, skill development for youth, and better implementation of government schemes at the panchayat level. The event witnessed the active participation of representatives and technical experts from various departments including Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Rural Development, Mission Shakti, and Tribal Welfare. Experts from KVK Sundargarh and line departments conducted demonstrations and awareness sessions on Improved farming techniques, Organic composting and vermiculture, Water conservation methods, Livestock vaccination and management, entrepreneurship development through SHGs and Van Dhan Vikas Kendras. Key schemes explained and promoted during the session included PM-KISAN, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Gramin) and other schemes. Interactive sessions were organized to address the concerns of villagers. Issues like delayed irrigation facility shortages, and non-availability of timely veterinary services were raised by participants. Officials took note of these issues and assured necessary follow-up and coordination at the block level. Women SHG members from the villages showcased forest produce, handcrafted items, and other local products. Officials encouraged them to form producer groups and connect with larger markets through Van Dhan Kendras and district-level federations. The visit played a crucial role in fostering awareness, participation, and government-community synergy in this tribal heartland.

aimed at promoting awareness of government welfare schemes, a high-impact programme was organized on 4th June 2025 at Ushra Village, under Kuarmunda Block of Sundargarh district. The objective was to bridge the information and service gap between the administration and citizens, especially among Scheduled Tribe communities and women. The event recorded a massive participation of 945 people, including 368 men and 577 women, indicating strong community mobilization and keen interest in government schemes among the local population. Women formed the majority of attendees, highlighting the growing influence and involvement of Self Help Groups (SHGs) and women-led initiatives in rural development. The programme was graced by Zilla Parishad Member Mr. Rajendra Khujur, who addressed the gathering and emphasized the importance of grassroots-level engagement in achieving inclusive development. He acknowledged the role of the government in bringing schemes closer to the people and called for active participation of citizens to ensure their effective implementation. Officials and staff from key departments—Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Rural Development, actively participated in the programme. They provided detailed insights into existing and newly launched schemes and demonstrated simple, low-cost technologies for livelihood improvement. The agriculture department conducted demonstrations on improved crop varieties, seed treatment, and organic manure preparation. The programme aimed to connect with the rural and tribal population and disseminate information regarding various developmental schemes launched by the Central and State Governments to uplift socio-economic conditions in the region. The event saw enthusiastic participation from five villages, with a massive turnout of 835 villagers—434 men and 401 women—demonstrating strong interest and community engagement in government initiatives. The programme was chaired by the Sarpanch of GP

Padampur, with the presence of the Samiti Member of the block, both of whom played a crucial role in coordinating local mobilization efforts. A total of 475 villagers from eight surrounding villages participated, including 190 men and 285 women, highlighting strong grassroots involvement, especially by women and Self Help Groups (SHGs). The event aimed at disseminating information on various government schemes focused on agriculture, livelihood generation, women empowerment, and rural infrastructure. A total of 422 villagers participated, including 178 men and 244 women, reflecting strong community engagement and active involvement of local women. Sarpanch Mrs. Basanti Singh inaugurated the session and

encouraged villagers to fully utilize the benefits of government schemes. Officials from the departments of Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry provided presentations and practical demonstrations. Emphasis was placed on schemes like PM-KISAN, KCC, MGNREGA, PMAY-G, and various skill training and entrepreneurship opportunities for rural youth and SHGs. Interactive demonstrations on vermicomposting, organic farming techniques, and nutri-garden development were conducted. The veterinary team offered advice on livestock health, preventive care, and improved feeding practices. Women SHGs showcased locally made products and were advised on scaling up through branding, digital marketing, and cooperative models. Villagers raised concerns regarding irrigation challenges, subsidy delays, and access to farming inputs. Officials addressed these issues and ensured that follow-up will be done through the block administration. The session concluded with a call for collective participation in the journey toward a self-reliant and developed rural India, aligned with the vision of Viksit Bharat@2047.

Venue: Lukumbeda Village Block: Nuagaon, District – Sundargarh, Odisha Total Participants: 435 (Male: 204, Female: 231) Villages Covered: 5 Local Leadership Present: Sarpanch – Mr. Kamal Kumar Horo As part of the ongoing Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan 2025, a village-level outreach and awareness programme was organized on 10th June 2025 at Lukumbeda village, under Nuagaon block of Sundargarh district. The objective of the programme was to sensitize rural households and tribal communities about various flagship initiatives of the Central and State governments, especially those linked to agriculture, women empowerment, health, and rural development. The event drew participation from five nearby villages, with a total of 435 attendees, including 204 men and 231 women. The programme commenced with the welcome address by Sarpanch Mr. Kamal Kumar Horo, who encouraged all villagers to actively participate in government initiatives to bring positive transformation to their communities. Departments including Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry were present to provide information and services. Schemes such as PM-KISAN, Kisan Credit Card (KCC), and various SHG-led livelihood initiatives were explained to the participants. Demonstrations on vermicomposting, soil health management, kitchen gardening, and livestock care were conducted. Women SHGs showcased handmade and forest-based products and were encouraged to utilize value chain development and branding opportunities. During the interactive session, community members raised issues related to land development, irrigation access, and housing scheme delays. Officials assured that their concerns would be forwarded for follow-up. The programme ended with a renewed commitment to grassroots development, emphasizing the importance of community participation in building a self-reliant and prosperous rural society.

The event aimed to raise awareness among the rural and tribal population regarding major government schemes promoting agriculture, women empowerment, livelihood, and community health. A total of 456 participants from eight nearby villages attended the programme, including 192 men and 264 women, reflecting strong local engagement. The session began with a community welcome, followed by addresses from officials representing various departments such as Agriculture, Horticulture, and Animal Resources Development. Detailed information was provided on schemes like PM-KISAN, CM-Kisan, KCC.. Emphasis was laid on how beneficiaries could access entitlements and how to link their activities with credit, insurance, and skill development. Practical demonstrations were organized on vermicomposting, soil nutrient management, and nutri-garden creation. Livestock health awareness sessions included guidance on vaccinations, fodder cultivation, and integrated livestock farming. SHGs showcased handmade and local products and were briefed on marketing, e-commerce access, and packaging improvements. During the interaction session, villagers raised issues regarding irrigation infrastructure, credit availability, and awareness gaps. Officials responded proactively and noted the suggestions for redressal through the Block Development Office. The programme concluded with a collective pledge to participate actively in village development and make full use of available government support for achieving the Viksit Bharat@2047

vision. The enthusiasm among youth and women marked a promising step toward inclusive rural transformation.

Total Participants: 1,040 (Male: 437, Female: 603) As part of the nationwide initiative Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA) 2025, a field-level awareness and outreach programme was organized at Dareikela village on 11th June 2025. The event witnessed enthusiastic

participation from the local farming community, with a total of 1,140 attendees, comprising 437 male and 603 female farmers. The strong presence of women participants highlighted their increasing involvement in agriculture and rural development. The programme aimed to sensitize the farmers about scientific agricultural practices, climate-resilient technologies, and government support schemes to help achieve the vision of Viksit Bharat @2047 through the transformation of Indian agriculture. The session began with a welcome address and an overview of VKSA objectives. Expert talks were delivered by agricultural scientists and field-level officers, focusing on: High-yielding and stress-tolerant rice varieties Water-saving techniques like Direct Seeded Rice (DSR) Integrated nutrient and pest management Soil health card utilization Use of biofertilizers and organic inputs Market linkages through FPOs and digital platforms Special emphasis was given to climate-smart agriculture, natural farming, and empowering women farmers through training and resource access. Farmers were also made aware of schemes like PM-Kisan, PMFBY, e-NAM, and Kisan Credit Cards (KCC). Demonstrations of mobile apps and agri-tools were carried out to encourage digital adoption in agriculture. Open interaction sessions allowed farmers to ask questions and share their challenges, which were addressed with suitable advisories by the experts. Information booklets, leaflets, and soil health cards were distributed to the attendees. The programme concluded with a collective pledge by farmers to adopt improved agricultural practices and contribute towards a self-reliant and developed rural India. The visit to Dareikela village was impactful, with encouraging community response and commitment. It reaffirmed the role of grassroots-level engagement in achieving the goals of Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan and ensuring inclusive growth in the agriculture sector.





Farmer Needs and Expert Interventions: VKSA Programme Findings

The Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA) programme in Sundargarh, Odisha, highlighted several critical needs and concerns voiced by farmers across various blocks. A recurring issue was the lack of adequate irrigation facilities and water scarcity, directly impacting agricultural productivity. Farmers also frequently raised concerns about access to quality seeds and other farming inputs, as well as delays in receiving subsidies or scheme benefits. Challenges related to market access, price support for produce, and lack of storage infrastructure were also prominent, impacting their income and post-harvest management. Beyond agriculture, communities expressed needs for improved road connectivity, better access to veterinary services, resolution of housing scheme delays, and timely ration distribution, indicating broader rural development concerns.

In response to these diverse needs, the VKSA programme facilitated crucial expert interventions and governmental support. Agricultural scientists and field officers provided guidance on scientific agricultural practices, climate-resilient technologies, and integrated pest and nutrient management. There was a strong emphasis on promoting organic farming, vermicomposting, and the use of biofertilizers to enhance soil health, alongside the distribution and explanation of Soil Health Cards. Detailed information was disseminated on numerous Central and State government schemes such as PM-KISAN, PMFBY, Kisan Credit Card (KCC) and PMAY-G aiming to improve farmers' access to credit, insurance, and housing. Furthermore, dedicated sessions focused on empowering women farmers and Self Help Groups (SHGs) through training, resource access, and guidance on value addition, branding, and market linkages for their products, including discussions on mushroom cultivation, backyard poultry, and agro-processing. Officials consistently assured farmers of follow-up actions and coordination at the block and district levels to address their concerns.

1. Seed Availability and Crop Varietal Access

Farmers participating in the VKSA Programme frequently voiced concerns regarding access to quality seeds and farming inputs. These challenges were prominent across various blocks, including Lathikata, Kuarmunda, and Bisra. Villagers from areas like Salangabahal in Kuarmunda block specifically highlighted issues with accessing farm inputs. Similarly, during interactions in Raiboga, farmers raised concerns about access to quality seeds. The difficulties in obtaining timely and suitable seeds directly impacted their agricultural practices and overall productivity.

In response, the VKSA programme and its expert interventions provided crucial guidance and awareness on crop varietal access and seed management. Expert talks delivered by agricultural scientists and field officers focused on high-yielding and stress-tolerant rice varieties, promoting certified seeds and farm-saved seeds, and encouraging community-level seed production of open-pollinated varieties to enhance local self-reliance and timely availability. Farmers were also sensitised to the benefits of specific modern inputs like nano urea and DAP. Demonstrations and advisories covered topics such as seed treatment, crop diversification, and horticultural practices. The programme aimed to equip farmers with the knowledge and resources to make informed choices about their crops and ensure better access to essential agricultural inputs, thereby contributing to increased productivity and resilience.

2. Awareness Gaps in Government Schemes and Subsidies

Farmers across various blocks frequently highlighted challenges related to awareness and access to government schemes and subsidies. For instance, villagers in Madhupur, Nuagaon block, raised concerns regarding subsidy delays and access to farming inputs. Similar issues were voiced at Badadalki, Lathikata block, where farmers queried delays in benefit disbursement under housing and farming schemes. In Kendudihi, Lahunipara, farmers expressed concerns about pending housing applications and ration distribution delays. Farmers in Raiboga, Kuarmunda block, also raised issues regarding delayed benefit transfers and subsidy access. Other concerns included awareness gaps regarding entitlements and linking activities with credit, insurance, and skill development and PDS delivery, MGNREGA wage delays, and PDS coverage.

In response to these gaps, the VKSA programme made concerted efforts to disseminate comprehensive information on numerous Central and State government schemes. Expert talks provided awareness on PM-KISAN, PMFBY (Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana), e-NAM, and Kisan Credit Cards (KCC). Detailed information was provided on schemes like PM-KISAN, CM-Kisan, and KCC, with emphasis on how beneficiaries could access entitlements. Programmes also covered MGNREGA, PMAY-G (Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana – Gramin), and various skill training and entrepreneurship opportunities for rural youth and Self Help Groups (SHGs). Further, awareness was raised about 15 key government schemes, including PM-KISAN, PMFBY, KCC, and 6 new initiatives from the Union Budget 2025–26. Officials consistently assured farmers of follow-up actions and coordination at the block and district

levels to address their concerns and provided on-the-spot clarifications and identification of beneficiaries for further follow-up.

3. Irrigation and Water Resource Management Challenges

A pervasive concern among farmers participating in the VKSA programme was the lack of adequate irrigation facilities and water scarcity. Villagers at Lukumbeda, Nuagaon block, raised issues related to irrigation access. This was a common grievance in Joketa, Madhupur, and Bareiguda villages, all under Nuagaon block. Farmers in Badadalki, Lathikata, also raised queries about irrigation support, a sentiment echoed in Khuntgaon, Lahunipada, where availability of quality seeds and road connectivity were also noted alongside irrigation. Issues concerning irrigation gaps were highlighted in Raiboga, Kuarmunda, and limited irrigation access in Kendudihi, Lahunipada. Shortages in irrigation facilities were also voiced at Kuliposh, Lahunipada, GP Padampur, Kuarmunda, Ushra, Kuarmunda, Gopna, Koida, and Rajamunda, Lahunipada. Sarpanch Nelson Munda from Jamudihi, Koida, also highlighted the need for improvement in irrigation facilities. In K. Balang, Koida, irrigation scarcity was among the village-specific concerns. Local panchayat representatives in Lathikata also shared field-level issues like water scarcity. Farmers in Jakeikela, Bonai, and Kuliposh, Lahunipada, similarly raised queries related to irrigation. In response, experts delivered talks focusing on water-saving techniques like Direct Seeded Rice (DSR). Farmers were encouraged to adopt water-efficient methods and sustainable practices such as water harvesting. During interactive sessions, scientists provided site-specific, low-cost, scientific solutions to address water management challenges.

4. Fish Farming and Aquaculture

The sources provide limited but specific information regarding fish farming and aquaculture interventions during the VKSA programme. Discussions included fishery-based livelihood opportunities. Furthermore, a highlight for one of the visits to Koida block specifically mentioned "fishery" and "pond structure". This indicates that while not a primary focus in every programme mentioned, the initiative did address this area as a potential income-generating activity and a component of integrated rural development. The Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA) programme in Sundargarh, Odisha, served as a crucial platform for identifying pressing farmer needs and deploying expert interventions. The feedback from farmers across various blocks revealed recurring challenges that warrant immediate

administrative intervention, alongside specific needs for capacity building and addressing crop and livestock health.

5. Situations Warranting Immediate Administrative Intervention

Farmers consistently raised a variety of issues requiring prompt administrative action. A pervasive concern was the lack of adequate irrigation facilities and general water scarcity. Villagers frequently highlighted delays in receiving subsidies or benefits from government schemes, particularly for housing, farming, and ration distribution. Access to quality seeds and essential farm inputs was another prominent challenge. Beyond agricultural inputs, communities expressed urgent needs for improved road connectivity, better access to veterinary services, and the resolution of issues related to market access and storage infrastructure for their produce. Local leaders, such as sarpanches, further amplified these concerns, stressing the need for improvements in basic amenities like drinking water supply and youth employment opportunities. Officials consistently addressed these concerns by providing on-the-spot clarifications, noting grievances, identifying beneficiaries, and assuring farmers of timely follow-up actions and coordination at the block and district levels.

6. Disease Outbreaks in Crops and Livestock

Concerns related to pest outbreaks and crop diseases were frequently voiced by farmers, underscoring the direct impact on their yields. In response, agricultural experts provided guidance on integrated pest and nutrient management strategies to mitigate these issues. For livestock health, farmers consistently highlighted the need for better animal health services. The programme's interventions included expert advice on livestock health, preventive care, and improved feeding practices. Discussions detailed vaccination schedules, deworming campaigns, and fodder management. Furthermore, information was disseminated on incentives and support for various income-generating livestock models, such as goateries, backyard poultry, piggery, and dairy units, along with the availability of mobile veterinary services to reach remote areas.

7. Identified Needs for Capacity Building and Farmer Training

The VKSA programme actively addressed identified needs for capacity building and farmer training through comprehensive outreach. Farmers were sensitised to scientific agricultural practices, climate-resilient technologies, and sustainable farming methods, including the use of high-yielding and stress-tolerant crop varieties, water-saving techniques

like Direct Seeded Rice (DSR), and the adoption of organic farming, vermicomposting, and biofertilizers. Significant emphasis was placed on soil health management, promoting the utilisation and interpretation of Soil Health Cards. Training also covered modern agricultural technologies, such as the use of nano urea and DAP (including drone application), farm mechanisation, and drudgery-reducing implements, along with digital adoption through mobile apps and agri-tools. Farmers received guidance on crop diversification, horticulture, and establishing kitchen/nutri-gardens. A major focus was on post-harvest management and value addition, with training on market linkages, branding, e-commerce, agro-processing, and entrepreneurial activities like mushroom cultivation and backyard poultry for Self Help Groups (SHGs). The programme also educated farmers on the importance of quality seed use and encouraged community-level seed production. Furthermore, extensive awareness was raised about various Central and State government schemes (e.g., PM-KISAN, PMFBY, KCC, PMAY-G), aiming to bridge awareness gaps and ensure access to benefits. The discussions also identified specific farmer needs for focused training on protected cultivation and storage practices.
